
Next meeting - Sunday, September 12th - 15- 20 minutes after the service. Please join us.

Coffee Hour Update.


Coffee hour is every Sunday after church. **Please signup to volunteer for September**. We need 1-2 volunteers per Sunday. **PLEASE!!**

A message from Sr Warden Noel Dawes.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Yesterday began the 22nd week of Ordinary Time, and we used Proper 17 readings in our Eucharist. But this is no ordinary time for us at St. Mary's and it is proper we remind you that Fr. Lou's installation and Celebration of New Ministry starts at 11 A.M., Saturday, September 11th. This day is one we hope our whole church congregation will be able to enjoy and celebrate. Fr. Lou's ordination to the priesthood was "his" day. September 11th is "our" day. We hope the weather and Covid situation will allow us to have a meal after this special service. Celebrations like this do not happen every day – our last one was over 8 years ago when Fr. Dave was installed as Rector.

But this time is no ordinary time for St. Mary's in a different way, and we are dealing with it in a proper way.

We have verified there seems to be an extensive bat activity inside the church roof. Thankfully, the LORD has blessed us by not letting bats come into the main body of the building, but the knowledge that they are "up there" is worrying several people who know about them, including Fr. Lou.

The Vestry had a survey done, which confirmed what we had been told and has unanimously decided to get rid of them. We have contracted with Simply Green Pest Solutions of Corinth to do the work at a cost of \$16,000. A deposit of \$5,000 was paid today (Monday, Aug 30). Doug Wester, the owner, did an excellent job sealing and cleaning the Rectory in July and has been quick and responsive since then when a bat flew in last week and Fr. Lou called him late at night.

The work will remove all the affected roof insulation and clean and sanitize the whole roof space. All bat entry and exit points will be blocked, having first made sure every bat is out. New roof insulation will be installed, and the roof monitored to check the work has been done effectively. This is a major task and may also include the Vestry deciding to authorize extra expenditure to seal the steeple above ladder height. The action will also deal with squirrels, mice, rats, racoons, and weasels (although I haven't personally noticed anything else other than bats squirrels and chipmunks). All the work is warrantied for a year.

The other proper thing to do is to let you all know that work will start tomorrow, Tuesday, August 31 at about 8:30 A.M. It will last about 2 weeks and our target is to have it all finished before the Installation on 9/11. *Mr. Wester is aware of our service and other activity times and dates and plans to minimize any disruption to people coming to and from church through any of the doors. For*

example, he will need to use a hydraulic elevator to get to the higher points of the roof but it will not be used in a way that hinders access and passage around the church.

Now we know "bats in the belfry" and roof is a large problem and has potential health hazards associated with it, we would be irresponsible not to take the necessary action to deal with it. We would not be practicing what we preach, loving our neighbors, in a Christian way if we did not act.

In the near future we will be letting you know of our plans to repair some brickwork on the Rectory chimney; and repairs to some wooden slats in the cupola directly above the altar before we get rain coming in or wind damage to the roof.

We are so grateful that each of you has, with outstanding grace, already made huge adjustments and changes to routine in magnificent ways during the last 18 months and we are sorry to have to add another potentially disruptive burden to life. But we know you will all respond magnificently to this challenge. Thank you for rising to the moment.
