An Update from Meryl on Birthdays and Anniversaries.



Advent started November 28th and will end before Christmas. It is a time the church has set aside for spiritual preparation of ourselves for Christ's coming in the past (incarnate Christ-birth of Christ), present (Christ in Word and Sacrament), and future (Christ's coming again in glory). It is a time of quiet anticipation, deep reflection, and contemplation of the things of utmost importance. It is a time of recognizing that if Christ is going to come again, into our hearts, there must be repentance.

Advent is the beginning of the Christian liturgical year, and our church decorates the altar in blue during this time. We celebrate hope, peace, joy, and love by lighting the advent wreath every week.

The Albany Refugee Resettlement Ministry (ARRM) is a ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Albany that has been serving Tri-City communities for over three decades, mainly through St. Francis Mission in Albany. Since its creation, the ARRM has endeavored to assist the small but constant trickle of displaced people from every corner of the world. This ministry aids people running from wars, totalitarian governments, poverty, persecution, and natural disasters who have made their way here to our Diocese. The organization welcomes these refugees and aids their assimilation into American culture through this ministry.
